Prone Rifle Long Range Informal 50m & 100yds Leagues Summer 2021

These two informal competitions are offered in 2021 as a fill-in competitions for shooters who are able to access a range and wish to have the additional challenge that a sticker always brings!

Format

- Course of fire: 10 rounds of 10 shots @ 50m/yds, 10 rounds of 10 shots @ 100yds
- Local scoring by the nominated person
- Free entry – just mail the league organiser with the names of people for whom you'd like a set of stickers. Include an average if the shooter does not have a Dorset League average.
- No closing date for entries – stickers will be issued shortly after entries are received.
- All entrants will shoot as individuals in their most recent Dorset League official class (see published list). Shooters new to Dorset competitions must declare an average.
- Highest aggregate in each class at each distance wins the class for that distance.
- All cards to be shot by the **Monday 6th September 2021** (regardless of when stickers were issued)
- All scores to be received by the league organiser by **Monday 13th September 2021**
- No prizes or medals, but certificates to class winners

About local scoring.

Historically, Dorset have not used local scoring for most Summer leagues, but we are using it for these competitions in order to reduce the potential for spreading the virus. To make it successful it is very important that common scoring standards are applied by all clubs, so please follow these rules:

- Each Club must nominate one person to be the scorer and to be responsible for the accuracy and submission of all scores. This person must either be a *Qualified* or *Approved* scorer.
 - A person will be deemed to be *Qualified* if they hold a current NSRA scoring qualification.
 - A person will be deemed to be *Approved* if they have participated in a Dorset RA run scoring course, or have been otherwise approved by Dorset RA (e.g. by Toddy in previous years)
- Each club must give the name and qualification/approval of the nominated scorer. This information must be entered on the score sheets that are sent to the scrutineer
- Scores must be collated and submitted using the score sheet supplied by the league organiser – no other form will be accepted.
- Score sheets may be submitted by e-mail in pdf or excel format, or as a hardcopy by royal mail.
- Score sheets must be received by the league organiser on or before the published deadline.
- The league organiser will request some shot cards to be submitted for the purposes of auditing the consistency and accuracy of local scoring. If any significant scoring errors are discovered, more cards will be requested and submitted scores may be altered.
- Cards should be retained until after the official results are published
- If in doubt, please ask!
